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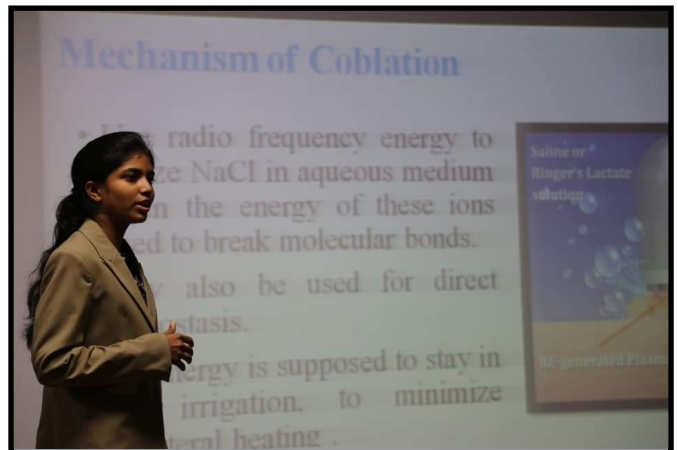
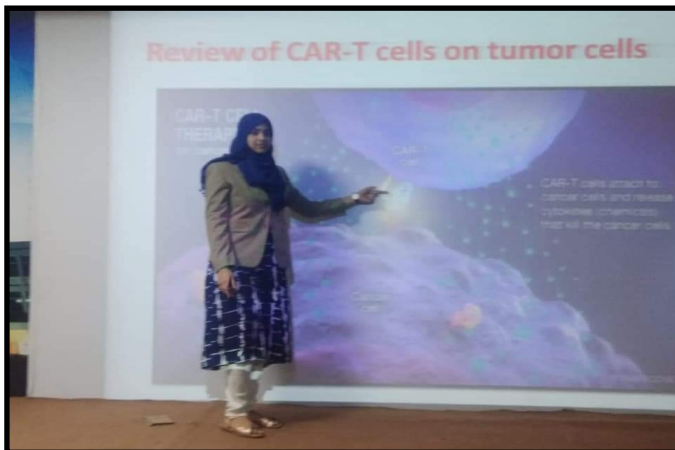
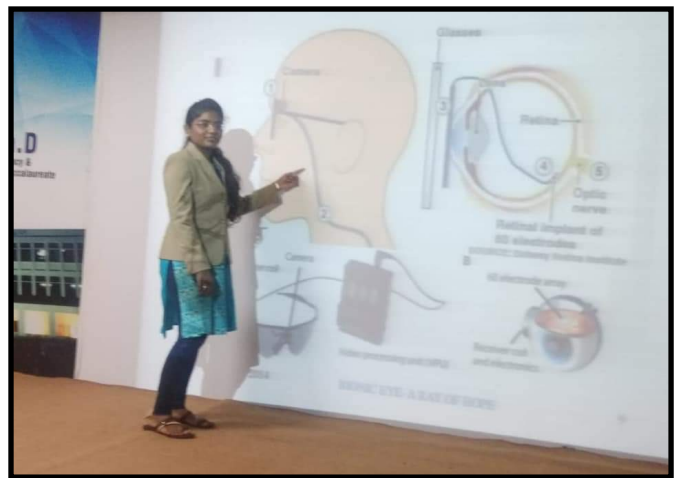
Oral Presentation by Students

Work Shop on “Interview Skills for Company Recruitment”

A one day workshop held at St. Peter’s Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Hanamkonda on “Interview Skills for Company Recruitment” by Dr. Jagannath Rao, an eminent Parapsychologist & HRD Trainer, Bengaluru Hanamkonda in association with Indian Pharmaceutical Association (IPA), Hanamkonda Branch.

The program aimed at unlocking the students’ potential by creating self awareness and improving inter-personal skills. Dr. Jagannath elaborated on personality development skills, soft skills and differentiated among the issues viz., passion, goal, dream, success etc., that a student should develop in order to crack the interview.

He stressed on hard work, being compassionate towards one’s own profession, enjoying what one does as mantra for success. He explained about the extrovert qualities in students by encouraging them to be focused and productive every day. The two main obstacles for the success is to overcome psychological fear i.e., not taking the criticism or comments in a positive way resulting in students are losing their lives for small failures even. In this connection Dr. Jagannath gave examples of a few people who failed in their academics but got a huge success in their interested activities like Dhirubai Ambani, Sachin Tendulkar etc.

Also he stressed the importance of confidence and belief in one's self as per their abilities, focus more on their strength and face the negative side of the life. Never to compare with others in any aspect but only take inspiration from others. In this regard he suggested students to watch videos related to facing interviews for more
