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1.3.1: Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability in transacting the Curriculum

The institution has included many course types into the curriculum to address cross-cutting themes pertaining to gender, human values, sustainability, the environment, and professional ethics. The University has already included two courses in the curriculum for B.Pharm: Environmental Sciences (a subject for the second semester) and Professional Ethics (a topic covered in the fifth semester subject, Pharmaceutical Jurisprudence). Courses such as human values and gender sensitivity are introduced as two-week add-ons (daily two hours). These courses aim to educate students on a variety of topics, including current environmental challenges, the relevance of upholding human values and ethics in all vocations, the necessity of gender sensitive awareness, discrimination, and best practices for gender equality. study of the environment A three-credit course is part of the B.Pharm curriculum. Raising students' knowledge of environmental issues is one of the goals of incorporating environmental courses at the UG level. Teach fundamental facts about the environment and the issues that surround it.

Professional Ethics: One of the topics covered in a B.Pharm degree course is the "code of ethics of pharmacy profession," which aims to educate students on the ethical considerations that a pharmacist should have when it comes to their trade, career, and employment. The pharmacist's oath to educate the students about professional ethics while on duty is also included. Gender Sensitization: For UG students, there is an extra two-week session that lasts two hours every day. Increasing students' understanding of gender problems in modern India is the goal of adding this subject. to provide a critical viewpoint on the socialization of men and women. to inform pupils about several crucial gender-specific biological traits. to familiarize students with debates about the economics and politics of the workplace. to encourage critical thinking on gender violence among students. to provide them a deeper understanding of the interactions between men and women.
